- NZCEL Level 4 is comparable to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) Mid B2 (i.e. IELTS 6.0).
- NZCEL Level 5 is comparable to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) High B2 level (i.e. IELTS 6.5).



What You Will Learn?

Graduates of the NZCEL Level 5 will be able to:

- Understand extended complex oral academic texts on a range of concrete, abstract and technical topics.
- Participate flexibly and effectively in extended spoken discourse on complex academic topics.
- Understand, analyse, and evaluate complex written academic texts on a range of topics.
- Write well-structured, accurate, evidence-based, extended academic texts on complex and technical topics.



NZCEL Programmes Structure

- NZCEL Levels 4 & 5 are a 16-week course.
- There are two parts, parts A and B.
- Part A focuses on developing skills and is course bookbased. Students are assessed internally.
- Part B is topic-based and focuses on applying skills in authentic contexts. Level 4 is assessed with NZQA Unit Standards.







NZCEL programmes consist of approximately 600 hours of study (total student effort), which corresponds to a 60 credit value of the aualification.

Entry Requirements

International students must meet the following requirements:



NZCEL Level 4 Academic

- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Produce evidence of proficiency in English equivalent to a Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) Low B2. This may be demonstrated via a recognised English language testing system such as IELTS, PTE, or achievement in the NZCEL Level 3.
- · Possess the appropriate student visa.



NZCEL Level 5 Academic

- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Produce evidence of proficiency in English equivalent to a Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) Mid B2. This may be demonstrated via a recognised English language testing system such as IELTS, PTE, or achievement in the NZCEL Level 4.
- · Possess the appropriate student visa.

Where a prospective student for the NZCEL Levels 4 or 5 programmes cannot produce evidence of current English proficiency, Bridge will use its own Internal English Proficiency Test (IEPT) to assess and determine the appropriate entry level.



Education Pathways

NZCEL Level 4 can lead to:

- NZCEL Level 5 Academic.
- · This certificate facilitates meeting the language requirements for undergraduate studies at most New Zealand Universities.

NZCEL Level 5 can lead to:

· Meeting the language requirements for degrees that are linguistically demanding and/or in a specialised field of study.
